This is an optional and voluntary SHA vaccination clinic for students aged 12 to 17 for those families who choose to access this service. This clinic will serve students in the communities of Clavet, Colonsay and Allan.

Please note: School staff will not collect or manage student consent forms in any way. Parents or students will hand the consent form to the nurse at the vaccination clinic.

#### Student vaccination clinic details

- Parents/students do not need to make an appointment for the student vaccination clinics.
   They are considered "walk-in" clinics. Unfortunately, the government's printed materials reference appointments.
- Students who are currently 11 years old, turning 12 later this year, are not eligible for vaccination in the student vaccination clinics being held in June. Students must be 12 years old at the time of the vaccination clinic.

#### Leaving the school to go to a student vaccination clinic in the community

As part of your communication with your families regarding upcoming student vaccination clinics held in your communities, please remind parents of the need to record a student absence if a student leaves school to attend a clinic in the community during school hours.


