ADMINISTRATOR'S MESSAGE

October

If your child is sick, please keep them at home. We had a number of safety and cleaning protocols in place last year, and we have continued many of them again this year. As a result, last year we had a very low number of students who were contracting seasonal colds and flus. We still have the expectation that students who present with COVID symptoms stay home until they are symptom-free for 24 hours. Now that more families have access to rapid COVID tests, we are finding more students arriving at school with symptoms, but with families reassuring us that they have passed a negative test for COVID. One of our new realities for school is that we need students who present with symptoms of being sick to stay home. Our concern is not solely that they may spread COVID in the school; our concern is that they may spread any disease in the school including colds and flus. If your child is sick, please keep them at home. We recognize the challenge that this presents for families, but we feel it is important to be able to keep our entire school safe and well.

Please note that as of Friday, October 1, the Public Health Order governing mandatory self-isolation for people who are a close contact of a positive COVID-19 case has been updated with one important change we want to highlight. If a student is **not fully vaccinated**, and they are a close contact of a **household member** who has tested positive for COVID-19, they are no longer exempt from self-isolation to attend school. These students must stay home and not attend in-person learning, or extra-curricular activities. This is not a school or division process; this is a change to the provincial Public Health Order. If your child must self-isolate, or needs to stay home for any reason, please remember to report the absence to the office and check with your teacher about updates using their Google Classroom.

Please remind your children to wear their masks properly while at school. Saskatchewan continues to lead the country in a number of COVID caseload indicators. As we work to get through this 4th wave as safely as possible, it is essential that we make every effort to follow the provincial public health orders – including wearing a mask while indoors.
