Lost and found tables have been set up for students to claim any lost items. Please encourage your child(ren) to look for anything that they have lost. Items not claimed will be donated soon.







Supporting Family Literacy

We know that a strong partnership between schools and families is crucial for student success. January's *Family Literacy Day* allowed us to access some excellent tools to share with our families, and we wanted to make sure you had these available to you.

Family Literacy Day, an initiative of ABC Life Literacy Canada, raises awareness about the importance of reading and engaging in other literacy-related activities as a family. Taking time every day to read or do a learning activity with children is crucial to a child's development and can dramatically improve a child's literacy skills.

Here are some ways schools can work with families to encourage Family Literacy activities:

- Share this <u>activity book</u> with your families there are great activities to promote outdoor activity and literacy!
- Include a monthly literacy challenge in the newsletter encourage families to share pictures and include those in the next newsletter.
- Send home lists of great books for different reading levels in your school – get some ideas <u>here</u> but be sure to also include student and teacher recommendations
- Encourage parents to be reading role models by sharing this statistic: 57% of kids who are frequent readers have parents who read books 5–7 days per week (Kids and Family Reading Report – Scholastic. 2017).

Is your school interested in setting up an Outdoor Story Walk on your school grounds? We have laminated copies of *When the Trees Crackle with Cold: A Cree Calendar* by Bernice Johnson-Laxdal and Miriam Korner. You can use the Story Walk to encourage families to visit the school and participate in a literacy activity together!
