We continue to move forward with the construction project – albeit slowly. We are confident in the next few weeks we will be able to walk down our main hallway from one end of the school to the other. This will definitely make elementary physical education classes and library visits more accessible. Hats off to the staff and students on their patience throughout this project.

We are thankful for the coaches, volunteers, and supporters of our fall activities. The football team wrapped up their season with a provincial championship on our home field. It was a great team effort during challenging field and weather conditions. Our volleyball teams are in the process of completing their seasons, and our musical crew is working hard in preparation for their fall production. We are fortunate to have so many people involved in these activities. Thanks for your ongoing support to make our students experiences richer.

As seems to be a national trend, we continue to struggle to attract volunteers for extra projects at the school. We are also struggling to put on our Christmas supper for our grade 7-12 students. We recognize that this is a huge event, requiring substantial volunteer support. At this point, we are looking for parental support to be able to put on this event. We will send out a separate message to solicit that support. We will regular classes on December 22nd, culminating with a school dance and open gym for the last period of the day for our grade 7-12 students. K-6 homeroom teachers will inform their classes and parents of their plans for the day.

Many of you are aware that we are currently working with a new student communication system called Edsby. Teachers are able to send messages and update parents and students on their progress and attendance. In order to receive attendance updates, parents will need to both sign into Edsby and turn on their notifications. We are not able to print progress reports at this point using Edsby. Parents and students will need to log onto their Edsby accounts to receive their updates. Elementary progress reports are scheduled for November 25th and grade 10-12 comments are due to be released on November 25th as well. 

WINTER RECESS GUIDELINES

Clavet School has established the following temperatures as a guideline for winter recess time. We would like all students to be dressed properly (winter jacket, ski-pants, toque, mitts, boots etc.) as we try to go outside as much as possible. Many students ask to go outside even when temperatures dip low. The temperatures (including the windchill) are based on Environment Canada's temperature of Saskatoon.

- -26 °C and warmer everyone outside
- -27 °C to -39°C All students dress up and run to shack and back or be a part of Polar Bear Club
- Polar Bear Club only those dressed properly will have the option to stay outside with teacher supervision
- 40 °C and colder everyone is to be indoors





Sleds: need to be soft foam and they usually have a thin layer of plastic on the bottom. No hard plastic will be allowed for student safety.
