Principles Report

Brian had proposed to the division that a second vice-principal be added to our school. He advocated that our school would be a good fit as we are a K-12 school and almost all of the students busing and staying over lunch break. This proposal was made many months back and has now been approved! Honey Maes has accepted the position as a .5-time capacity. Keeping her home room and ELA/Math classes.

Construction – The hall way between the 2 sides is now open. The main office is ready with the principals and VP’s moving into their new offices. The entry way is almost complete and they are hopeful it will be completed in a week or so. Once that is completed and the main entrance is accessible to the public the remaining admin staff will move to their new home.

Servery – The servery will be fully functional with all fridges and freezers being relocated there (now that the school is connected again) The school would like to start the hot lunch program again and are looking for parent volunteers to help repair soups/stews/chili’s once or twice a week. The goal of the servery is to provide a healthy option for everyone at a low cost. Prices to cover costs only, not to make money. The selling and “manning” of the servery will be managed by the school and the student. They are looking for help with preparing the hot lunches.

Breakfast Program – is starting again. Looking for parent volunteers to help cut up and prepare breakfast items daily.

Christmas Concert – will be held December 15th 1:30 and 7pm sitting K-6 in the old gym

School counselor – Nicole Tkachuk is new to the school but is an experienced counselor. She is helping coordinate this year’s Christmas Hamper Program.

Trustee's report

Dawn reports that they are working on securing a meeting with the MLA's for that support the school division. They are planning on bringing issues to the MLA's to advocate for more support. Group discussion around the costs of supplies to support learning have gone up dramatically this year and are not covered in the budget increase for the year.
